Papa tells his daughter what will change and what will stay the same after he and his new wife have a baby.

Bond, Rebecca. **Just Like a Baby** (PIC BOND, R.)

All the members of a family help create a beautiful cradle in anticipation of the arrival of a new baby.

Bruel, Nick. **Bad Kitty Meets the Baby** (J BRUEL, Nick)

Bad Kitty is not pleased when a baby joins her family.

Bunting, Eve. **Will it Be a Baby Brother?** (PIC BUNTING, E.)

A little boy is certain that his expectant mother will give birth to a baby brother.

Child, Lauren. **The New Small Person** (PIC CHILD, L.)

Elmore Green likes being an only child, so when his parents bring a new small person, his baby brother, into the house he is not pleased and does his best to keep the new small person out of his life.

Cole, Joanna. **The New Baby at Your House** (J306.875 COL)

Havill, Juanita. **Just Like a Baby** (PIC HAVILL, J.)

Delighted by the arrival of baby Ellen, extended family members describe their plans for the young one, from becoming a fisherman to playing the saxophone, but baby Ellen prefers other activities.

Henkes, Kevin. **Julius, the Baby of the World** (PIC HENKES, K.)

Lilly is convinced that her new brother is the worst thing that has happened until Cousin Garland comes to visit.

Fleming, Candace. **Smily, Lily** (PIC FLEMING, C.)

Family members try everything to stop the baby Lily from crying.

Fuller, Rachel. **My New Baby** (BB Ful)

Part of the Just Enough: Difficult Topics Made Easy series, this non-fiction picture book introduces young children to the basics of reproduction in a way that is gentle, age appropriate, and accessible.

Rodowsky, Colby. **Ben and the Sudden Too-Big Family** (J RODOWSKY, Colby F.)

Until now, ten-year-old Ben has believed that life is made up of "all right" and "not all right" stuff, but when his father remarries and the couple adopts a Chinese baby, he wonders which kind of stuff will prevail.

Root, Phyllis. **What Baby Wants** (PIC ROOT, P.)

Saltzberg, Barney. **Cornelius P. Mud, Are You Ready for Baby?** (PIC SALTZBERG, B.)

Cornelius wonders when the new arrival will be ready to play.

Shipton, Jonathan. **Baby Baby Blah Blah Blah** (PIC SHIPTON, J.)

When her parents tell her that they are expecting a baby, Emily sets to work on a list of pros and cons.

Van Leeuwen, Jean. **Benny & Beautiful Baby Delilah** (PIC VAN LEEUWEN, J.)

Benny is not pleased when his new baby sister, Delilah, arrives at his house.
